



Schematic

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Tips & advice

START KNITTING

Before you start knitting, we recommend that you practice the different techniques and stitches with our tutorial videos, especially if it's your first time knitting. You can find the videos in our website:

weareknitters.com

If you don't get it on your first try, don't worry, it's very common. Watch the video with your needles and wool in your hands as many times as you may need.

Cotton care instructions

Our 100% Pima cotton is the best in the world. This is why we recommend that you handwash your final project with cold water and mild soap. Lay your garment flat to dry. This way you will maintain the cotton's original softness and brightness. To learn more about WE ARE KNITTERS cotton, read the CONCEPT area on our website.

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Stitch sample

It is important to knit a sample before you start knitting your project. The sample should measure 10cm x 10cm and needs to be done in stockinette stitch. If it comes out smaller, you will need to knit more loosely, and if it comes out bigger, you will need to knit your stitches more tightly.

Stitch sample:

19 Stitches = 10cm / 4in

22 Rows = 10cm / 4in

HUAYNA TEE

This project is knit in two separate pieces that are later sewn together.

Before starting to knit it is important that you are acquainted with the following techniques:

Yarn over: bring your working yarn from the back of your work to the front between the points of both needles and make it go over the right hand needle.

Single decrease: slip one stitch knitwise, knit the next stitch, with the tip of the left hand needle pick up the slipped stitch, pass it over the knit stitch and throw it off the needle.

Double decrease: slip one stitch knitwise, knit the next two stitches together, as if they were one stitch, with the tip of the left hand needle, pick up the slipped stitch, pass it over the two stitches that are together and throw it off the needle.

START KNITTING

FRONT

1. Cast on 81 stitches on one of the wooden needles.

2. Knit rows 1-6 in garter stitch. That is, knitting every stitch in every row.

3. Work rows 7-80 in stockinette stitch. That is:

Odd rows: knit all stitches.

Even rows: purl all stitches.

4. Work rows 81 and 82 in stockinette stitch making the following increases:

Row 81: increase 9 stitches at the

beginning of the row and knit every stitch. You will have a total of 90 stitches.

Row 82: increase 9 stitches at the beginning of the row and purl every stitch. You will have a total of 99 stitches.

5. Work rows 83-89 as follows:

Odd rows, knit every stitch.

Even rows, knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches and knit the last 3 stitches.

6. Work rows 90-92 as follows:

Row 90: knit all stitches.

Row 91: knit all stitches.

Row 92: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches and knit the last 3 stitches.

7. Work rows 93 and 94 as follows:

Row 93: knit 3 stitches. *Turn your work and knit these 3 stitches*. Repeat from * to * 3 more times. Now, insert your needle into the next stitch and wrap the yarn over the needle as if to knit the stitch, but instead of going around the needle once, wrap your yarn around it 3 times. Finish knitting the stitch as you would normally.

Repeat this throughout the whole row until you have only 3 stitches left. Knit them and repeat from * to * 4 more times.

Row 94: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches inserting only one of the yarn overs of the previous row and letting the others fall off the needle. Knit the last 3 stitches.

8. Work rows 95 - 98 as follows:
Row 95: knit every stitch.

Rows 96, 97 and 98: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches, knit the last 3 stitches.

9. Work rows 99-104 in lace as follows:

Row 99: knit 4 stitches, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease. *Knit 1 stitch, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 2 stitches, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease*. Repeat from * to * until only 10 stitches are left. Knit 1 stitch, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 1 stitch, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 4 stitches.

Row 100 and every even number row: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches, knit the last 3 stitches.

Row 101: knit 5 stitches, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle, *make a double decrease, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 1 stitch, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle*. Repeat from * to * until only 11 stitches are left. Make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch, bring the yarn over your needle, knit one stitch, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 5 stitches.

Row 103: knit 6 stitches, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch. *Knit 2 stitches, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, make a single decrease, knit 1 stitch*. Repeat from * to * until only 10 stitches are left. Knit 2 stitches, knit 2 stitches together, bring the yarn over your needle, knit 6 stitches.

10. Work rows 105 - 110 as follows:
Row 105: knit every stitch.

Rows 106, 108, 109 and 110: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches, knit the last 3 stitches.

Row 107: knit every stitch.

11. Work row 111 like you did on row 93.

12. Work rows 112-115 as follows:

Rows 112, 114 and 115: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches, knit the last 3 stitches.

Row 113: knit every stitch.

13. Work rows 116-120 in stockinette stitch with a garter stitch border as follows:

Even rows: knit the first 3 stitches, purl the next 93 stitches, knit the last 3 stitches.

Odd rows: knit every stitch.

14. Cast off all your stitches.

BACK

1. Repeat steps 1 and 2 from the front.

2. Work rows 7-79 in stockinette stitch.

3. Work rows 80-82 in stockinette stitch with the following increases:

Row 80: increase 9 stitches at the beginning of the row and purl every stitch. You will have a total of 90 stitches.

Row 81: increase 9 stitches at the beginning of the row and knit every stitch. You will have a total of 99 stitches.

Row 82: repeat row 100 from the front.

4. Repeat steps 5-14 from the front.

HOW TO END YOUR PROJECT

1. Thread the sewing needle with a length of yarn of the same cotton and sew ONE of the shoulders. To do this, place the front and back against the other, with the reverse side of your work facing up and the front side of your work facing down. Sew about 28 stitches of ONE of the shoulders, make a knot and leave your sewing needle for the moment.

2. With your knitting needles, pick up and knit 86 stitches around the collar (43 stitches from the front and 43 stitches from the back). With these 86 stitches, work 3 rows in garter stitch. Cast off all the stitches.

3. With the sewing needle, sew the side of the neckband and the other shoulder in the same way as you did the first shoulder.

4. Sew the sides of the body and of the sleeves.

5. To finish, make a knot and hide the left over yarn weaving it in between the knitted stitches with the aid of the sewing needle. When you have weaved in a couple of centimetres, cut the extra yarn. Weave in all other ends in the same way.
